Job Description

This position will focus on agriculture systems and supply chains primarily in professionalized row crop production. The person in this job will be responsible for working closely with the Food Lab team to support existing project work that is focused on supporting our company partners to reduce carbon emissions and increase the adoption of regenerative agriculture across different supply chains, through both company specific and pre-competitive efforts. This person will work closely with the SFL team to provide project management support, collect and analyze data, evaluate program effectiveness, and design program communications to share learnings and story tell on behalf of projects. This position requires a person who can work confidently with both company partners, their suppliers, and the network of agronomists and farmers on the grounds in each unique region. We are seeking someone who is eager to jump right in and learn with our Food Lab team.

Our teams are high-performing and mutually supportive. We place a high premium on collegiality and shared learning.

Some travel is expected in this role.

Experience

At the Food Lab we appreciate individuals with good relationship skills and easy rapport with farmers as well as with business decision-makers.

Our ideal candidate will have several of the below qualifications:

- A history with large scale crop and/or livestock agriculture
- Agronomy or soil science knowledge
- Experience with GHG accounting protocols, agricultural economics and or grain merchandising

- Strong data analysis skills
- Communication skills, specifically the ability to interpret findings into effective storytelling for both project delivery and to share precompetitive learnings across broader audiences
